In his home city of Hamburg and on his travels abroad, he solves child-friendly crimes such as theft, fraud and smuggling. What makes these books special is their interactive format, in which readers are actively involved in the investigations as assistants. At the end of each case, a puzzle is posed, the solution to which must be worked out by reading the text carefully or examining the illustrations. Through this clever interactive element, the series combines exciting detective stories with playful reading practice and logical thinking.
